The Snow Queen:


This holiday project will explore all elements of Hans Anderson's icy story and follow Gerda's adventure up to the cold north on the 20th of December (ages 6-11).

THE HOUSE OF BENARDA ALBA





Rehearsals for Bernarda Alba have been in full swing, the company have been deeply investigating their characters, many of them trying to find motive or justification to why their characters act in the way they do. Member Elysia Sully plays the role of Bernarda, matriarch and some would argue tyrant. Below, she speaks on how it has been to play Bernarda.

Have you been able to sympathise with Bernardas character?

I don't think I can say that I sympathise with her; however, during the rehearsal we questioned Bernarda's motives for her cruel behaviour, possibly she was treated poorly by her husbands or her parents. Ultimately, she is a mother who believes she is acting with her daughter's best interests at heart, protecting them from men and societal scandal. These women live in a world where they have no freedom, perhaps in a way Bernarda wants to shield them from that truth.

Why do you think this production is relevant to us today? What is its importance?

The play explores themes of oppression, power and gender dynamics, all of which are still at the forefront of issues within our society today. Bernarda's authoritarian control over her daughters highlights the consequences of the patriarchal society and how Bernarda felt the need to gain control wherever she could. This production of Bernarda Alba reflects unfortunately timeless themes.

How difficult is it to play a cold character, do you prefer playing good or evil?

I have absolutely loved playing the character of Bernarda. It has been so much fun and so rewarding to unpick her character, which at first I thought was simply evil. I think in many ways 'evil' characters have so much more psychological depth to them which makes them so interesting to portray and they are so far removed from my own personality. Pretty much every time I would wipe Phoebe's (Angustias) face I would ask her backstage "Did I hurt you?". It has definitely been a challenge, and quite possibly the most challenging character I have played yet, but also the most rewarding as it has allowed me to hopefully deliver a performance that is both compelling and explores Bernarda's conflicted personality.

How do the props reflect the energy of the show?

I feel the variety of the props reflects the variety of the show. There's insane , whacky scenes placed in conjunction with poignant , emotional moments that somehow perfectly complement each other . There's never a dull moment and it's a pleasure to be part of it.

What has been your favourite part of rehearsals so far?

My favourite part of rehearsals so far has been the devising. It's an incredibly physical show so it was so exciting to work as an ensemble: compiling ideas and working together with Director Emily Quash to create so many movement sequences that not only look fantastic but are loads of fun to be part of !

What can we expect from this Christmas?

This Christmas the audience should expect to be taken on a journey like no other . They'll be meeting so many eccentric characters in odd settings , but also seeing some truly beautiful scenes that perfectly capture the essence of family and Christmas .

"Hello! My name is Louisa and I work as a Marketing Manager at the National Theatre, and I'm also a Playbox alumna! I started my job at the NT in July but have worked in theatre marketing for the last six years. I may be biased but I think I have one of the most fun offstage jobs in the theatre industry: I get to meet with lots of directors and writers to talk to them about their shows and then think about how I might get audiences to come and watch them. I write blurbs for shows that go on the NT's website, organise photoshoots to create show posters, attend press nights and so much more. No two days are the same!

I started doing circus skills classes at the Dream Factory when I was eight (probably because my mum wanted me to stop climbing things at home) and was a member right up until I went to university, taking part in several different classes and productions. I absolutely loved the feeling of being in an ensemble, working with likeminded people to create something we could all be proud of - and I still have that feeling now with my job! I knew acting professionally wasn't my calling, but Playbox made me interested in the theatre industry more generally and discover that there are hundreds of people involved in making theatre that never go on stage - but shows wouldn't happen without them. To this day some of my best friends are from Playbox and we all support each others' work, whether that's in theatre or not."
